



## **3rd Edition of the African Anti-Corruption Dialogue 9 to 12 October 2019, Kigali, Rwanda.**

**Arusha, 21 October 2019**

The African Union Advisory Board on Corruption convened the 3rd Edition of the African Anti-Corruption Dialogue on the theme “Towards a Common African Position on Asset Recovery” from 9 to 12 October 2019 in Kigali, Rwanda.

The annual Dialogue brought together 150 delegates from national anti-corruption authorities, civil society, the media, academia and international organizations to discuss the development of a common African position on asset recovery.

During the Dialogue, stakeholders were able to reflect on the challenges of asset recovery in Africa, propose solutions and contribute to the development of a common African position on asset recovery.

The dialogue framework also allowed to share good practices in asset recovery and facilitated the networking of stakeholders combating corruption in Africa.

Africa speaks with one voice on asset recovery through the dialogue.
